All information and the itinerary are subject to change without reason or notice at any time. The information provided is sourced from third parties and is not guaranteed by us, all interested parties must rely on their own enquires. All additional expenses caused as a result of persons not acting in accordance with the general schedule will separately meet the full cost of any fees and charges. All persons travelling on the tour must comply with the direction of the tour hosts. All persons must be in physical condition that the tour conditions require being the daily playing of golf in hot and humid conditions in a foreign country. All persons must seek their own independent medical and travel advice for travelling in the countries toured. The tour hosts accept no liability, or risk or claim whatsoever to any persons travelling on the tour. The tour hosts are not providing professional advice, they are on tour in their own capacity as golf players. The taking out of travel insurance is mandatory and all persons should seek independent advice in this regard. All in room and external expenses are the sole responsibility of the persons making those charges. Cancellation fees and charges apply if any part or all of the tour is cancelled at any time. The tour prices are subject to international exchange rates fluctuations and each tour persons may be subject to increases in tour costs as a result of the exchange rate. **There are NO Guarantees or Warranties. E&O E. Refunds will only be given if refunds can be obtained from the relevant third-party supplier.**

The Transportation Rule

If we hire a bus and/or car/s, then: Where possible we will limit potential liability for damage by taking out Collision Damage Waiver Insurance etc. However, the rental agreements are now specifying that we are fully liable for any under body damage etc. It is a condition of the tour that we share equally in any costs associated with damage to the vehicle no matter who is responsible. We also share equally any speeding fines (but not demerit points) etc. You are advised to always wear your seatbelt because next time we will probably not get away with it despite Richard's engaging and disarming manner with the constabulary.

Any use of any part of the transportation subsystem as a pseudo washing line by Bandido has no place in civilised behaviour and any infraction will be treated appropriately by the civilised tourists.

The Navigation Rule

While it has been a tradition that no tour is complete until we have become hopelessly lost at least once on tour we now also have to deal with the onset of dementia for most tour participants which may result in more 'missed flight incidents' To attempt to reduce the impact of poor navigation incidents, prequalification is required before a tour member is entitled to proffer directions. The holder of a degree in Law from an institution recognised by the Law Society will usually preclude the holder from being selected as navigator or the right to offer any advice on route selection. The Tour leader's decision on selection of the navigator is final and absolute.

The Mobile Phone Rule



Mobile phones have no place on the golf course except as allowed for score recording and hole mapping. Our respective clubs all ban their use for phone calls so there is no reasonable excuse for using them for phone calls on golf courses where we are guests. They should be turned off (so as to avoid the temptation to attempt to run your legal practice remotely and/or to do a quick check of messages at halfway). The use of a mobile phone for accepting or making calls will automatically incur the **uncontrollable wrath of the Tour Leader**.



Invitation to Tour

Invitation to tour is modelled on the approach used by the committee at Augusta National (i.e. we make the rules and we do not bend to pressure). However, preference is given to those with a long-term history of regular attendance. Consideration is given to those who have had genuine (preferably medical) reasons for missing a tour and/or those who are closely related to the Tour Leader. Negative preference is given to any tourist who tries to claim work commitments as a reason for missing a tour. There is a limit of six people on the Melbourne Tour unless the Tour Leader decides otherwise.

Distribution of Costs and Guest Fees

If the committee agrees to you inviting a day guest to join us for golf during the tour, then you take full responsibility for green fees and other expenses incurred by that guest. Such costs will be billed to you, and it is up to you to decide if you want to recoup them from said guest.

Expenses and Costs

You should advise the Tour Leader of any expense claims on the day that they are incurred. Any claims made after the tour has finished will be ignored.

The Tour Leader will keep a record of all costs incurred. The Tour Leader will normally pay all green fees and will account for them in the final reckoning. If you choose to use a cart, if possible, you should pay for it yourself and arrange any subletting arrangements with fellow competitors. For the avoidance of doubt Bandido's practise of dragging a pull buggy along while sitting in a cart at any time in a round will be considered to be, inter-alia, a contracted subletting arrangement and he will be automatically responsible for half of the full cart fee for that round.

The Tour Leader will provide a full reconciliation of expenses at the end of the tour, and you are expected to reimburse him immediately upon receipt of your notice of obligation. Your attention is drawn to the 'The Tour Leader is not a Bank Rule'.

Gold Coast Expenses and Costs

When a tour is held on the Gold Coast and accommodation is provided gratis by the Rankine brothers to participants who have not realised the benefits that accrue from living in Sanctuary Cove then cost for any restaurant meals will generally be shared by the participants who are taking advantage of the Rankine brothers largesse. This rule may be varied by negotiation as deemed necessary.

Dispute Resolution

There will be no disputes.

The Tour Leader is not a Bank Rule

The Tour Leader organises the tours because:

1. Lawyers cannot be trusted to organise themselves (as evidenced by the ridiculous hours they work)
2. The Tour Leader can control where and when we tour
3. We would never go on tour unless The Tour Leader organised tours

The Tour Leader does not charge a fee for organising the tour and pays most of the deposits up front on behalf of the tourists.

PLAYING AND COMPETITION RULES

The Rebel Tour Plate

The Rebel Tour Plate is awarded to the Champion Golfer (decided at the annual end of summer tour based at Victoria Golf Club) of the year. In 2008 despite many misgivings by the organizing committee it was agreed that Fitzpatrick and Dobbin could participate as a team. Clearly this represented a serious error in judgement by the committee and consequently similar aberrations in the normal operation of polite society will not be allowed again. The Champion Golfer will be decided on the best average score for all the rounds played. However, in equity it is recognised that some members will be freshness advantaged by playing a reduced schedule. Therefore, if some recalcitrant members do not complete the full schedule, then a golfer who plays all rounds will be allowed to drop one round from the averaging calculations (the Fitzpatrick Fairness Exclusion Dispensation). If all members play all rounds, then all rounds will count. Results will be calculated to the first decimal place (Lawyers will just have to trust the engineers on this one – we just do not have time to explain it to make up for the inadequacies of their education). In the event of a tie, joint winners will be announced.



The winner of the plate has their name engraved on the plate. Control of the engraving and location of the plate is the responsibility of John (Bandido) Fitzpatrick (if your permanent abode is more than 15 km from Kyle Bay then all the tour failures wish you luck in your attempts to wrest control of the plate from John). In addition, in past years, a magnificent trophy to be taken home and displayed to your adoring family was awarded to the Champion Golfer of the year. However, as the Tour Leader has lost interest in acquiring the trophy it will be presented to the Champion Golfer if the Tour Leader gets around to buying it. As the tour leader has not got around to organising a trophy since 2007 it is suggested that you don't get too excited about this.

Any other tours conducted throughout the years that have two or more Rebels participating may play for the honour of having the winner's name engraved on the plate but carry no possession rights. Such tours are designated 'engrave but not hold' tours.

The Leigh Brown Championship Trophy

In memory of our much-missed long term Rebel Tour companion, The Leigh Brown Championship Trophy was first played for on the 2020 Melbourne Tour. The

competition rules very much reflect, and attempt to correct, the travails Leigh (and other tourists) has had to shoulder over numerous domestic and international tours, namely that Bandido's handicap increases before the tour and invariably the competition is over well before the last round has commenced.

The Tour Leader will calculate achieved tour index using the World Handicapping System for all rounds on tour prior to the playing of the last round. The LRB Daily Handicap for each player for the Leigh Brown Championship Trophy will then be based on the RSGC White Tee figures (Par 72, Scratch 74, Slope 130). This winner of the Leigh Brown Championship Trophy will be the best score from the final round using the LRB Daily Handicap.

The Bill Kiely Scoring Excellence Trophy

In memory of our much-missed long term Rebel Tour American companion the Bill Kiely Scoring Excellence Trophy was instituted in 2020. After taking a conservative approach to the Rebel Tour Plate competition during his first three years on tour (1997, 1998 and 1999) Bill had discerned that the appropriate winning tactic was to start fast with some early big scores so as to demoralise the rest of the touring party and to the coast home to victory. He did this in 2000 becoming the first American Champion.

The winner of the Bill Kiely Scoring Excellence Trophy is the tourist who achieves the best stableford score from all rounds played on tour.

Course Rating (The Carter Amendment and the aging golfer revision)

It is recognised that the tour members are, increasingly, becoming eligible for Senior (and, in most cases Vintage) events. Therefore, the committee has agreed that we should choose tees that give most participants the opportunity to reach par four holes without having to always reach for their three woods and hope that they get a good kick off a sprinkler head. It is also recognised that most members have some difficulty in acclimatising to new courses. The benchmark for tee selection after the China Tour 2014 was based upon the White Tees at Royal Sydney Golf Club (rating 74, slope 130). It might be noted that the need for this rule did not become apparent until new tour member, Paul Carter, revealed an ability to hit 400 metre holes with a rescue club and an 8 iron. By 2023 it was recognised that drives of greater than 180 meters were becoming very rare so the new standard of 'as far forward as possible' was adopted for the RT 2023 Victoria tour. Despite some initial dissent by the end of the tour it was agreed by all participants that this standard should be universally adopted for all future tours.

Courses to be played (Bandido Exclusion Provision)

The Tour Leader may veto the selection of a course to be played as requested by Bandido on the grounds that it is even worse than the worst course ever previously played, it is just a crappy worthless course, it is entirely overgrown (the 'Nimmitabel excuse') or for any arbitrary reason that the tour leader cannot be bothered to explain.

NTP and Longest Drive

Because of past apathy and indifference, the Nearest the Pin and Longest Drive competitions have been cancelled. If somebody can be bothered to organise and account for these events, feel free.

The Rebel Tour Cup,

There is a Rebel Tour Cup in somebody's possession. This was originally for the best scratch golfer, then for a variety of other competitions. As nobody can remember the current rules for the award of the Rebel Tour Cup (and nobody cares) the control of the rules (and of the Rebel Tour Cup) is now in the hands of John (Bandido) Fitzpatrick.

Handicaps

Handicap Indexes are as per GolfLink (or GHIN) on the morning of the Monday preceding the tour. Daily Handicaps are set at afore mentioned Handicap Index. Daily Handicaps are not adjusted during the tour. The maximum allowable Daily Handicap (the Farrugia amendment) was 18. This rule has now been relaxed to allow the use of higher handicaps if the committee (upon examination of golf link records and perusal of submissions from interested parties) deems that a player has no chance of playing to 18. This very generous concession may be rescinded mid tour if evidence is presented to suggest prior sandbagging has been undertaken or that reverse pivots have been eliminated from a player's swing repertoire.

Qualifying Rounds

Scoring is via the Stableford System. A minimum of four rounds must be played. Competition rounds must be over 18 holes to be included unless the course is only 9 holes in length in which case the score for 9 holes is included and the average calculated on that basis (e.g.[for the avoidance of doubt] if 10 rounds of 18 holes and 1 round of 9 holes are played then the total score is divided by 10.5 – Lawyers will need to attend remedial arithmetic classes if they still don't understand this calculation). If more than two rounds are played in a day, then the third round is not included in the competition results unless unanimous agreement of all those on tour is reached prior to the commencement of the round (The Cheltenham amendment).

Lost or out of bounds Ball.

A special lost ball rule applies for the tour. If a ball cannot be found in a reasonable time (3-minute maximum) or a player elects not to search for their ball then they can treat the point at where the errant ball was last seen (or where it crossed an out of bounds line) as the entry point to a lateral water hazard. A new ball can then be dropped **in the rough** within **two club lengths** of where it was last seen, and one stroke penalty taken. If a ball is found, then that ball must be played as it lies or declared unplayable (i.e. a player cannot find their ball and then elect to use the Tour lost ball rule). **Note: This is a very generous concession. Don't push your luck.** In general, only the player who has lost a ball should look for it. All other players in the group must play their ball before they offer to assist another player in looking for a ball. When another player starts to help looking for a ball then the ball is deemed to be lost 1 (one) minute after the time when the player starts helping to look for the ball.

Provisional Ball

It is recognised that following a particularly bad shot that ends up in the 'donga' one is often inclined to hit a provisional ball to rid oneself of the 'idiot swing demons'. If one chooses to put the provisional ball into play, then a penalty stroke is not applied (i.e., if you hit a provisional ball off the tee then your next stroke will be your third stroke). It is expected that you will not spend three minutes looking for your first ball then elect to play your provisional ball. This rule is subject to the 'Bandido Exception clause' that you may only play one provisional ball off the tee and to the 'second Bandido exception clause' that if you hit into a Penalty Area then you must play the ball under the R&A rules relating to balls in Penalty Areas. If you lose your first ball off the tee and you then lose your provisional ball, then you must either drop a ball approximately where your provisional ball was lost (therefore playing your 4th shot from that position) or play from the tee again with the addition of one penalty shot (therefore playing your 5th shot). Unfortunately, this clause needed to be added because the Engineers in their wildest dreams cannot envisage all the ways Lawyers can find to take advantage of fair and reasonable rules.

Mulligans

On rare occasions (particularly if alcohol is involved) your first shot of a round might be particularly disgusting (e.g. a topped tee shot on RMGC East). In such cases a mulligan may be played. This rule only applies to the first shot of a round and does not mean that every other player is immediately entitled to a mulligan. This is not a 'hit until you are happy rule'.

Putting Green

No penalty will be incurred if an opponent's ball is hit on the green while putting (but laughter is allowed).

Bunkers

If a player's ball gets an abnormally bad lie caused by somebody failing to rake a footprint, then, subject to approval from a competitor, the ball may be placed in a better lie. This rule should only be used for obviously unfair situations, not to cover the usual crappy raking techniques used by other golfers.

Gimmes

Gimmes are not encouraged. However obvious (i.e., 6 inches or less – that's 15 cm – we have been using the metric system since 1972) putts may be conceded. Putts for 3 or more Stableford points must always be holed. The Leigh Brown (and Sergio Garcia) 'backhanded rolling indifferent' putt does not supersede this rule.

Early Calls

Early calls are a blight on the game and should not be used by those with the 'Power'.

Ready Golf

If you are ready to hit, then you should hit even if it is not your honour or if somebody is stuffing around behind you. Try not to hit Tim as he will be some distance in front of you by the time you finish stuffing around. Make your club selection and get ready to play while other competitors are hitting, not after you have watched all the other players attempted shots.

Preferred Lies

Automatic taking of preferred lies is not encouraged. However, if, on the fairway, your ball is in a divot or sand filled section then you may, with the approval of your fellow competitors, take a preferred lie. Preferred lies may also be taken whenever there is a reasonable expectation that you might damage your clubs or yourself (e.g., hitting tree roots [the relief from a root amendment], playing off rocks or stones etc)

Speed of Play

The lowest handicapped person in each group is responsible for keeping the group moving. As a guide the maximum time for each hole should be 16 minutes for par 5s, 14 minutes for par 4s and 10 minutes for par 3s. Thus, on a typical course (4 par 5s, 4 par 3s and 10 par 4s) should take approximately 4 hours to complete. 4.5 hours is getting into the very slow range. 5 hours is totally unacceptable.

Local Rules

Local Rules in the spirit of the Rebel Tour Philosophy may be introduced by consensus (i.e. by the Tour Leader as he sees fit) as and when required and do not require ratification by the R&A or the USGA. Your attention is drawn to the "Laws of Golf" and "Senior Rules".

TRIVIA

The laws of golf

LAW 1: No matter how bad your last shot was, the worst is yet to come. This law does not expire on the 18th hole, since it has the supernatural tendency to extend over the course of a tournament, a summer and, eventually, a lifetime.

LAW 2: Your best round of golf will be followed almost immediately by your worst round ever. The probability of the latter increases with the number of people you tell about the former.

LAW 3: Brand new golf balls are water-magnetic. Though this cannot be proven in the lab, it is a known fact that the more expensive the golf ball, the greater its attraction to water.

LAW 4: Golf balls never bounce off of trees back into play. If one does, the tree is breaking a law of the universe and should be cut down. This law does not apply to John (Bandido) Fitzpatrick.

LAW 5: No matter what causes a golfer to muff a shot, all his playing partners must solemnly chant "You looked up," or invoke the wrath of the universe.

LAW 6: The higher a golfer's handicap, the more qualified he deems himself as an instructor.

LAW 7: Every par-three hole in the world has a secret desire to humiliate golfers. The shorter the hole, the greater its desire.

LAW 8: Topping a 3-iron is the most painful torture known to man.

LAW 9: Sand is alive. If it isn't, how do you explain the way it works against you?

LAW 10: A golfer hitting into your group will always be bigger than anyone in your group. Likewise, a group you accidentally hit into will consist of a football player, a professional wrestler, a convicted murderer and an ATO agent -- or some similar combination.

LAW 11: All drivers are demon-possessed.

LAW 12: Golf balls from the same "sleeve" tend to follow one another, particularly out of bounds or into the water (See Law 3).

LAW 13: A severe slice is a thing of awesome power and beauty.

LAW 14: "Nice lag" can usually be translated to "lousy putt." Similarly, "tough break" can usually be translated "way to miss an easy one, sucker."

LAW 15: The person you would most hate to lose to will always be the one who beats you.

LAW 16: The last three holes of a round will automatically adjust your score to what it really should be.

LAW 17: Golf should be given up at least twice per month.

LAW 18: All vows taken on a golf course shall be valid only until the sunset.

Rebel Tour Senior Rules

- Rule 9.k.34(a) If a tree is between the ball and the hole, and the tree is deemed to be younger than the player, then the ball can be moved without penalty. This is so because this is simply a question of timing; when the player was younger, the tree was not there so the player is being penalized because of his age.
- Rule 1.a.5 A ball sliced or hooked into the Rough shall be lifted and placed on the Fairway at a point equal to the distance it carried or rolled into the Rough with no penalty. The senior player should not be penalized for tall grass which ground keepers failed to mow.
- Rule 2.d.6 (b) A ball hitting a tree shall be deemed NOT to have hit the tree. This is simply bad luck and luck has no place in a scientific game. The senior player must estimate the distance the ball would have traveled if it had not hit the tree and play the ball from there.
- Rule 3.B.3(g) There shall be no such thing as a lost ball. The missing ball is on or near the course and will eventually be found and pocketed by someone else, thereby making it a stolen ball. The senior player is not to compound the felony by charging himself with a penalty.
- Rule 4.c.7(h) If a putt passes over a hole without dropping, it is deemed to have dropped. The Law of Gravity supersedes the Rules of Golf.
- Rule 5. Putts that stop close enough to the cup that they could be blown in, may be blown in. This does not apply to balls more than three inches from the Hole. No one wants to make a mockery of the game.
- Rule 6.a.9(k) There is no penalty for so-called "out of bounds." If penny-pinching golf course owners bought sufficient land, this would not occur. The senior player deserves an apology, not a penalty.
- Rule 7.G.15(z) There is no penalty for a ball in a water hazard, as golf balls should float. Senior players should not be penalized for any shortcomings of the manufacturers.
- Rule 8.k.9(s) Advertisements claim that golf scores can be improved by purchasing new golf equipment. Since this is financially impractical for many senior players, one-half stroke per hole may be subtracted for using old equipment.

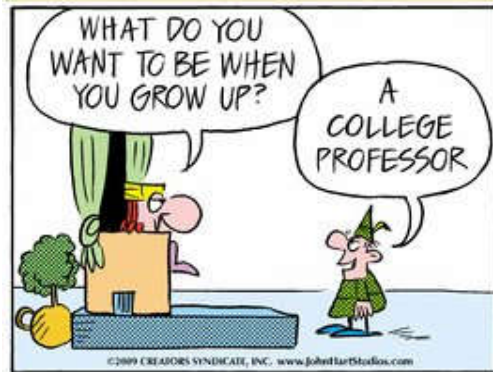

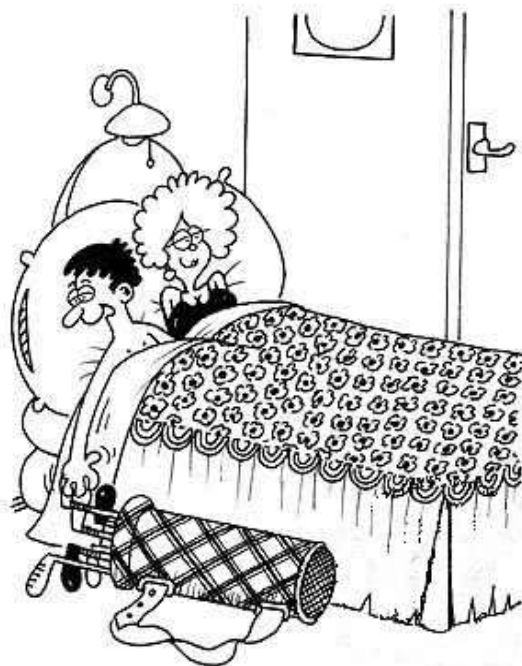

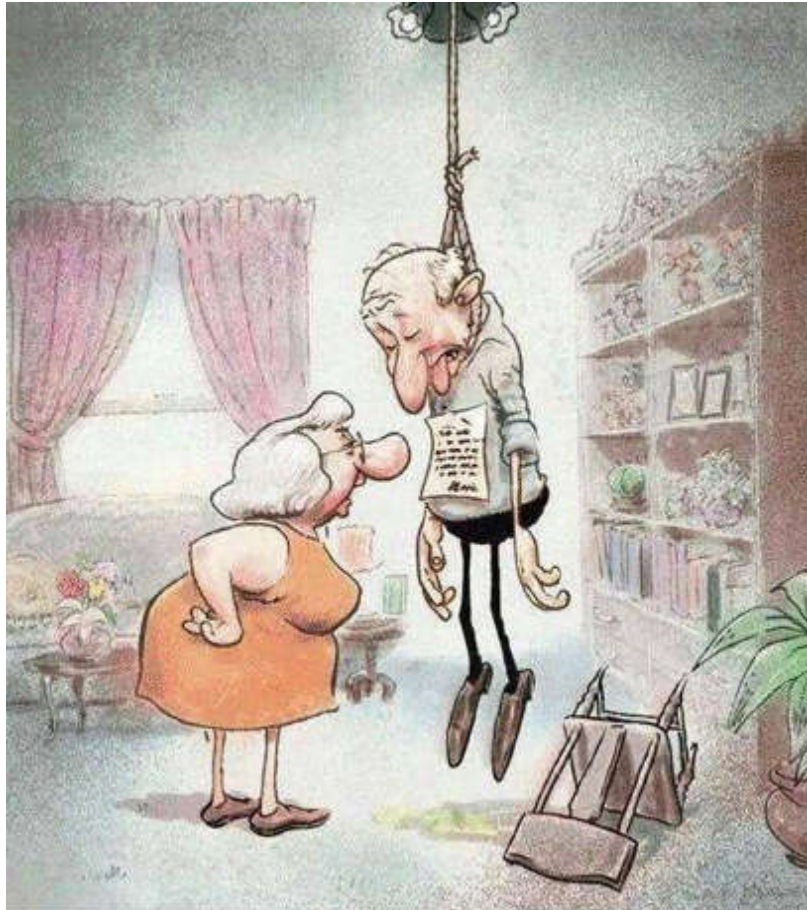
